Vaccines are considered a healthy choice for your child. They protect your child from diseases that can cause serious illness, disability and death. In BC, school-age children are offered immunizations in grade 6 and in grade 9. These immunizations are offered at school throughout the school year.

Hepatitis B HealthLinkBC File # <u>25a</u>	2 doses (if 3 doses not received in infancy) 2 rd dose 6 months after 1 st dose		
Meningococcal C vaccine HealthLinkBC File # 23a	1 dose		
Varicella [‡] (chickerpox) HealthLinkBC File # <u>44b</u>	1 or 2 doses ‡ 2 nd dose at least 3 months after 1 st dose		
HPV (girls only) (human papillomavirus) HealthLinkBC File # 101b	2 doses 2 ⁿⁱ dose 6 months after 1 st dose		
Tdap (teanus, doitteria, penussis) HealthLinkBC File # <u>18c</u>		1 dose	
Children who had chickenpox or shinoles disease at 1 year of age or older do not need the chickenpox			



vaccine. Children who received a single dose of chickenpox vaccine at a younger age only need 1 dose in grade 6. Children who have never received the chickenpox vaccine need 2 doses.
