## ADULT GRADUATION PROGRAM SUMMARY

- Students must be at least 18 years old to be put on the Adult Program
- Students must earn a minimum of 20 credits to be awarded a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Adult Dogwood Diploma)
- Students must complete a minimum of 3 qualifying courses after they are put on the Adult Program. (after 18 years of age)
- Provincial exams are not required on the Adult Program but may be requested by post-secondary institutions.
  - English Language Arts 12
  - a Math 11 or 12 (includes Accounting 11)
  - Ministry-Authorized grade 12 course
  - Ministry-Authorized grade 12 course
  - 1 more Grade 12 Ministry-Authorized course OR Social Studies 11
    - ... plus any upgrading courses to be ready for these

## **'REGULAR (2018)' GRADUATION PROGRAM SUMMARY**

- Students must earn a minimum of 80 credits to be awarded a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma)
- These must include 48 credits for required courses, a minimum of 28 elective credits, and 4 credits for Graduation Transitions.
- Students must complete a minimum of 16 credits at the Grade 12 level, 12 credits in addition to a required Language Arts 12 course. Therefore, a student will need a minimum of 12 credits from grade 12 elective courses
- Usually, 1 course equals 4 credits
